TYPES OF AGREEMENTS

There is 2 types of agreements:

- Bilateral agreements (between the sending university and
- BCI-PQÉÉ agreements (inter-university Cooperations Office -Québec student Exchange Program)



The Quebec university system consists of 3 study cycles. Students can have access to the first cycle after 13 years of schooling.


- Cycle 1: Undergraduate degree (3 to 4 years)
- Cycle 2: Master's degree (2 years) and Cycle 2 diploma
- (1 year) Cycle 3: Doctorate (3 to 5 years)

WARNING: Students cannot mix courses from tro different cycles.

TEACHING LANGUAGE AND LANGUAGE **PROFICIENCY** At UQTR, courses are taught in French for all undergrad's courses. Students must, therefore, be able to speak, read, and write in French. The minimum acceptable level is intermediate/advanced or the equivalent of Level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

UNIVERSITY CALENDAR

Semester 2 (Winter) Starts in January and ends in April For more information, university calendar.



WARNING: The exam period is included in each semester (Usualy the last two weeks of the semester).



Tips and tricks

Session/Semester/Trimester: At UQTR, we use the term session to define the period of courses. We estimate that a session is equivalent to 15 weeks of classes, so it also corresponds to the term *trimester*.

Welcome week:

We suggest arriving on campus approximately 2 weeks before classes begin. Students are notified by email about the mandatory welcome session, the steps to follow upon arrival and any other relevant information.

Learning agreement and study contract:

All documents requiring a UQTR seal must be signed by the Registrar's Office approximately 3 weeks **after the beginning of the semester**.

Residence authorization, visa/ study permit/ CAQ:



- Please refer to the Canadian and Quebec Government websites.
- For stays of more than 6 months (2 semesters), students must obtain a Study Permit and a CAQ **before the stay.**

Housing:

Insurance:

For insurance and medical attention in Québec, students must go on our website.



Medical coverage is <u>mandatory</u>. According to the regulations of the Ministère de l'Immigration, all international students temporarily staying in Quebec must have health and hospitalization insurance for themselves and their accompanying dependents.

WARNING: No health insurance obtained in the country of origin will exempt students from the cost of medical coverage.

Reciprocity agreements: Students that participate to a mobility program at UQTR and are from one of the country that has a reciprocal social security agreement with Quebec (Belgium, Greece, Finland, France, Danmark, Luxembourg, Norway, Portugal, Sweden, Romania) must, before departure, obtain a certificate of affiliation from the social security organization in their country and, upon arrival in Québec, register with the *Régie d'assurance maladie du Québec* for the Québec health insurance plan. (RAMQ).





Steps:

- Partner's universities nominate theirs students by e-mail at echange.bri@uqtr.ca.
- We will send each nominee an email as to know how to apply on the online platform MoveOn.
- Student mobility team and all connected departments will evaluate the application according to due dates.
- Applicants will receive an official answer by e-mail according to the timeline below.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

It is important to prepare your student's application form because they will have only a few days to apply on our online platform MoveOn. Here's all the documents your student needs to upload on our online platform:

- Copy of birth certificate displaying the full names of the candidate's father and mother
- Copy of the passport
- UQTR BIR-10 form (course choices) available on MoveOn
- The last pre-university year transcript of records (high school diploma in some countries)
- All official pre-university diplomas (high school diploma in some countries)
- All transcripts of records for each year of university completed (including the current year or semester if already available)
- All university diplomas (if applies)
- Recommendation letter from a professor of the sending university
- Curriculum vitae with photo
- Motivation letter
- BCI form (if the agreement falls under BCI-PQÉÉ)
- One of the following proof of language proficiency (if French isn't the mother tongue):
 - DALF (Diploma in Advanced French)
 - DELF (Diploma in French Studies)
 - Letter from the sending university certifying the student's proficiency in French
- Portfolio (for <u>art</u> and <u>new media</u> programs)

WARNING: For rejected students applying through BCI, we will provide the application documents to the mobility advisor of the Québec's university listed as the second choice on the student's BCI's application form.

CREDITS EQUIVALENCY AND E.C.T.S

Students will have to choose a number of credits per semester:

- Undergraduate degree: **12 to 15 credits** (4 or 5 courses of 3 credits each)
- Graduate studies: **9 credits** (3 courses of 3 credits each). It is not possible to go over 9 credits because of the course load.



WARNING: Generally 1 course of 3 hours (3 credits) is equivalent to a personal workload of 6 hours each week during 15 weeks.
